Peter Watts drew our attention to this issue in a recent committee meeting. Bath CAZ has been in operation for some time, and Bristol's came into force on 28 November.

To check if charges apply to any of your vehicles, visit:

https://www.gov.uk/clean-air-zones

and enter your registration number.

As an example, I looked up my 1970 Traveller, and the result is this:

#### This vehicle is exempt from charges in all clean air zones

Vehicle number plate LPO405J is exempt from all clean air zone charges and there is no charge to drive it in any of the zones.

# Charities

At our AGM we invited suggestions for charities we could support in 2023. Reviewing the suggestions, your committee decided that priority should be given to local charities and that these should include the Wiltshire Air Ambulance; and St Rose's School, Stroud, via Wheelnuts.
